Rural Tobacco Use: Research and Interventions

Two projects in the Center for Tobacco Products that involve rural health will be described: (1) a public education campaign about smokeless tobacco, and (2) the Population Assessment of Tobacco and Health (PATH) Study, an ongoing nationally representative, longitudinal cohort study of tobacco use in U.S. adults and youths. For the smokeless tobacco education campaign, we will present our message development process beginning with target audience identification, creative concept development in focus groups, quantitative copy testing focusing on identification of the rural target audience, and findings which inform health messaging in rural populations. We will share information about the study conducted to evaluate the campaign (RuSTEC), including methodology on recruitment and retention, baseline sample information on demographics, the prevalence of smokeless tobacco use, and susceptibility and tobacco-related beliefs. For the PATH Study, we will describe the study methods, the data being collected (and how you can access it), demographics of the study population, and the results of an analysis of smokeless tobacco use and its association with the use of other tobacco products. The PATH Study may be useful for understanding rural Americans' use of traditional and emerging tobacco products.
