

Integrated Laboratory System to Advance the Safety of Human and Animal Food Cooperative Agreement Program

Program Description

- Enhance the nation's food safety, as directed by the Food Safety Modernization Act (FSMA).
- Support and enhance human and animal food testing laboratory activities.
- Offer trainings, workshops, meetings and other educational resources.
- Conduct research on national testing capability and capacity.
- Prepare best practices and other guidance manuals.
- Improve communication among regulatory and public health partners.

Intended Outcomes

- Advance the goal of a national food safety system by supporting and enhancing state human and animal food testing laboratories tasked with surveillance and emergency response testing, including investigations of foodborne disease outbreaks.
- Provide the additional support to these laboratories through the activities of an association that will conduct research on national testing capability and capacity.
- Develop best practices and other guidance manuals.
- Offer trainings, workshops, meetings, and other educational resources.
- Support ISO/IEC 17025 laboratory accreditation for non-accredited laboratories.
