


FDA at a GLANCE


FY 2021 FDA Budget by Program



Notes: Infrastructure includes rent, rent related activities, FDA buildings and facilities, and White Oak consolidation. Other programs include Export Certification and Color Certification Fund.

- FDA's budget for Fiscal Year 2021 is:
- approximately \$6.1 billion.
- provided by federal budget authorization (54%, or \$3.3 billion) and user industry fees (46%, or \$2.8 billion).
- equivalent to \$10.01 per American per year and includes 18,062 full time equivalents (FTEs).

The share of a program's funding paid by industry user fees varies from about 1% for Foods to 100% of Tobacco regulatory activities.
